A Message from The Pastor

King Solomon wrote in **Proverbs 3:5-6**, “**Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight.**”

For the last couple of years, one way that the Lord has made our path straight at Chestnut Grove Church is by giving us a clear, biblically sound, and memorable vision. This vision is **to be a light on a hill sharing the love of Jesus Christ**. But as great as this vision is, it needs action steps in order for us to strive to make this vision more and more of a reality.

An idea sprang up during a recent Sunday School meeting which was that the action steps fit very well with the acronym of SON. The SON stands for Service, Outreach, and Nurture. Our Outreach Team liked this idea and then our Leadership Team decided to officially adopt this for our church.

I am excited to now share with you that our full vision statement is now “To be a light on a hill sharing the love of Jesus Christ, by following Jesus (The SON) through Service, Outreach, and Nurture.” **Service** refers to offering one’s time, talents, and treasure to bless others in our church community. There are many needs to be met within a church in order for it to thrive. One big area of need is more help with Sunday School for children and youth. There are lessons that are all prepared for the leaders, but we need people to step up to serve. It could be as little as once a month as an assistant teacher, for example. But the more that we as a congregation are willing to serve, the more ministries we can offer.

Outreach is pretty self-explanatory in many ways. But essentially, the church is called to be that light on a hill for the world. We reach out through various events, but also through invitations for others to come to worship or church events. We also reach out by sharing Jesus with others and by seeking to live Christianly in everything we do.

Finally, the **Nurture** is critically important as well. Nurture is all about growing and maturing as Christians. Friends, we are to always pursue growing in our love and knowledge of Jesus Christ. I know that for me, even though I graduated from seminary in 2019, I have taken a handful of courses after

graduation simply to keep growing as a follower of Christ. The truth is that the more you are nurtured and grow in your walk with the Lord, the more that you want to keep growing.

Certainly, there are ways we can pursue being nurtured in our faith here at Chestnut Grove. This includes our men's group ministry (2nd Sunday from 8:45-9:45), women's group (monthly outings), new adult Sunday School class (begins Sept. 10th in Fellowship Hall), Thursday morning Bible Study (10:00-11:00 in Fellowship Hall), Book Study Group (at the Dillsburg Library), our Bible Book of the Month, children's Sunday School, Wesleyan Small Group (coming this fall – time and day TBD). Additionally, we also are in the process of partnering with the AWKNG School of Theology. Currently, there are 15 Bible-focused courses available through AWKNG. I have taken 3 thus far and plan to take them all in time. I will be promoting these courses that are self-paced (you have a year to complete a course) and can be done in the comfort of your home. The current courses include the following:

Questions Aloud: Introduction to the Unseen Realm; Questions Aloud: Basic Apologetics; History of the Bible; What is the Gospel?; Unseen Realm 101; Unseen Realm 102; Contemporary Post-Modern Apologetics 201 (Old Testament); Contemporary Post-Modern Apologetics 202 (New Testament) The Attributes of God; The Apocalypse of Jesus Christ: The Significance of the Book of Revelation in the First Century and Today; The Dead Sea Scrolls and the New Testament; Jewish and Greco-Roman Background of the New Testament; The Doctrine of Salvation; Two Powers in Judaism in Second Temple Texts, and The Divine Christ.

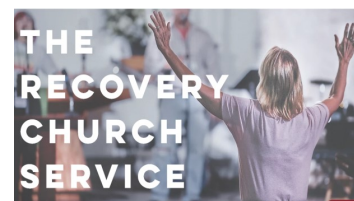

Vacation Bible School - July 16-20 - A Huge Success!!



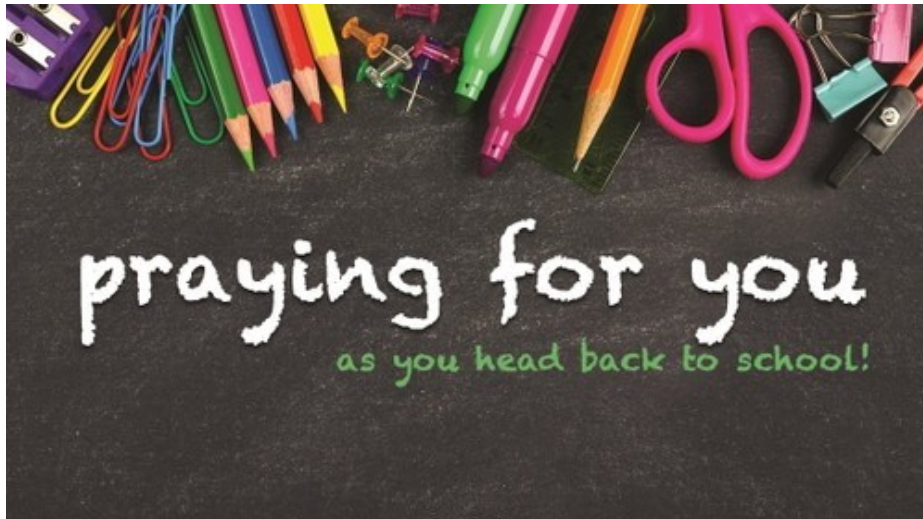

Outdoor Worship and Picnic - Sunday, August 27



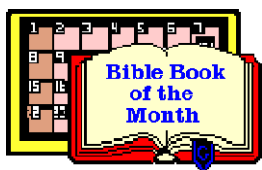

September - Bible Book of the Month - Hebrews



I would like to remind you that our Bible books of the month are always invitations and not requirements. I simply offer the book of the month as one means by which the Holy Spirit can be used to guide your time in God's written Word.

We are blessed to highlight the letter to the Hebrews as our Bible book of the Month for September this year. Even though the author is not named within the letter, leading to various suggestions from biblical scholars today (i.e. Paul, Barnabas, Philip the Evangelist, Apollos, Priscilla and Aquila), the author would have likely been known to be the earliest recipients of this powerful epistle.

But even though the human author is unclear for us today, the contents of this letter are very significant. The letter to the Hebrews makes it abundantly clear to the Jewish people that the coming of Jesus the Messiah was great news for the Jews. As good and gracious as God's covenants with Israel have been through their long history with God, the New Covenant that Jesus established is far better for them. Jesus' sacrifice is better than the Old Testament sacrifices and does not need to be repeated, like those of the Old Testament (which only temporarily covered sin, but did not remove sin completely).

Moreover, Jesus was raised from the dead and intercedes for those that put their trust in Him (He is an eternal High Priest). Additionally, Jesus is able to cleanse the guilty conscience of those that trust in Him.

By the time of the writing of this letter (which was probably prior to 70 AD, because it appears that sacrifices were still being offered at the Temple in Jerusalem and the Temple was destroyed in 70 AD), many Jewish Christians have been persecuted for their belief in Jesus as the Messiah. This letter succeeds in conveying the truth that there is nothing more Jewish than believing in Jesus as the Messiah. Jewish people are not betraying their ancestry by putting their trust in Jesus as their King and Savior. Instead, Jewish believers in Jesus are completed Jews, as some messianic Jews refer to themselves today.

But the letter to the Hebrews is a great blessing not only to the Jews, but also to everyone that believes in Jesus. It should encourage us in our faith and fill us with gratitude for the great love of Jesus that led Him to do all that He did for us.

May your faith be strengthened as you prayerfully read and meditate on the letter to the Hebrews this month.

October's Bible Books of the Month will be Hosea and Joel. November's Bible Book of the month will be Romans.

Men's Ministry Group - September 10



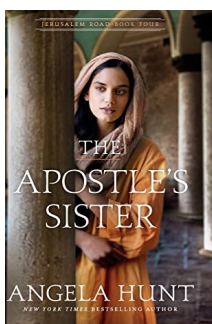

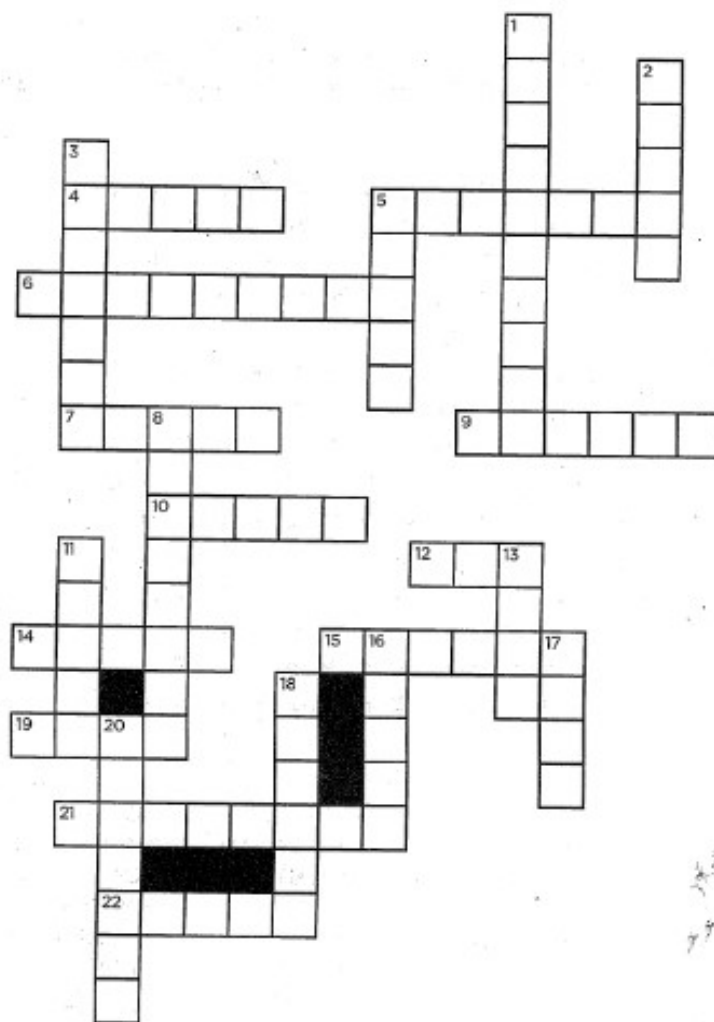

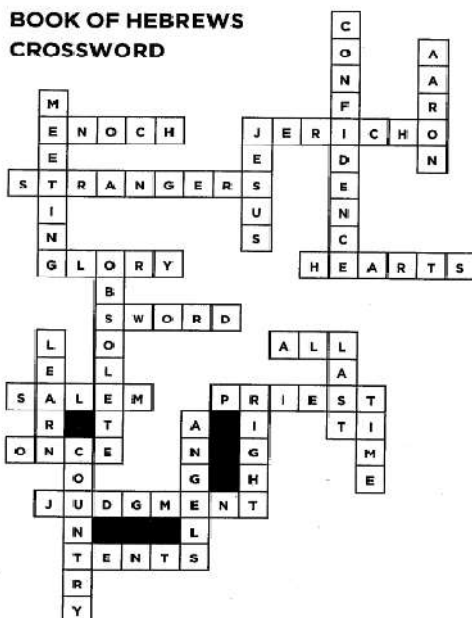
