#### A Message From The Pastor

On December 31, we as Chestnut Grove Church had a Covenant Renewal Service. This service is meant to focus God's people on seeking to live out the greatest two commandments, according to Jesus. These commandments are first to love God with all our heart and soul and mind and strength. And second, to love our neighbors as we love ourselves.

2024 looks to be a very interesting year ahead in the world. There is uncertainty with the economy. We have war in the Middle East and between Russia and Ukraine. There is the expected craziness that comes with this being a major election year as well. With all those things swirling around us, and of which we should pray about of course, it is easy to lose our focus on seeking to live out these two most important commandments.

My hope and my prayer for all of us as Chestnut Grove Church is that we would have a laser focus on these two commandments in 2024. In order to do this, we must fix our eyes on Jesus and seek to be intentional in living every day for Him. Interestingly, I believe that when we wholeheartedly pursue living out the greatest commandment, we will naturally seek to live out the 2<sup>nd</sup> greatest commandment to love our neighbors as we love ourselves.

So what can we do to cultivate loving God with all our heart and soul and mind and strength? The key is to get every aspect or part of our life focused on living for Him. When it comes to our loving God with our hearts, it reminds me that our highest affection is to be towards our Triune God. We cultivate this through our daily prayer walk with God. We are to build an increasingly intimate relationship with our Lord. Time together in prayer must be our greatest treasure and our highest priority. As friends share with one another about the good, the bad, and the ugly of life, we must seek to do this with our Lord.

Our soul can refer to our will and our emotions. We must choose to live every day for God. We must offer all of our emotions as worship to the Lord. Reading and meditation on the psalms and other scriptures helps us do this well.

Our mind includes our thinking and our understanding. We are called to be transformed by the renewing of our minds (See Roman 12:2). Loving God with our minds is so important and will involve learning. This takes

intentionality and does not happen automatically. Just as someone can attend school and not learn because they are not seeking to learn and grow, it is also possible to come to church each week and not be seeking transformation and greater understanding.

Our Lord desires to put His Word into practice in our daily living. We have an opportunity each Sunday at worship to allow God to transform our mind through God's Word as it is read and proclaimed. But we also have opportunities in other ways to be intentional in this way. For every newsletter in 2024, I plan to have copies, in our lobby, of a chapter from a book entitled *Passionate Conviction*. Reading these chapters is meant to encourage you and I to be very intentional in allowing the Lord to renew our minds to think more and more like Jesus.

Additionally, we have our Thursday morning Bible Study each week from 10-11:00AM. This is an excellent opportunity for those of us that are available to meet during this hour of the week. I would love to offer another Bible study on a weeknight or weekend if there is interest. Please see me if you would like to be a part of something like this, if Thursday mornings do not work for you.

Moreover, Chestnut Grove Church has a partnership with a terrific school called AWKNG School of Theology. While the information taught in these courses is at a high level, it is also very accessible for anyone to engage in (no Bible experience is necessary!). Please strongly consider taking a course in 2024 (financial assistance would be available, if requested). I do not want anyone to not take a course because of the cost. Information on all the courses is available on a table in the lobby.

As biblical scholar N. T. Wright states, "early Christianity was very much a *bookish* culture. We sometimes think of the movement as basically a 'religion'; but a first-century observer, blundering in on a meeting of Christians, would almost certainly have seen them initially as belonging to some kind of educational institution. This is the more remarkable in that education in that would was mostly reserved for the rich, for the elite." So friends, with the help of God's spirit, let us earnestly seek to love God with all of our minds in 2024.

Finally, we are called to love God with all our strength. This involves offering our body as a living sacrifice and seeking to use every part of our bodies as instruments of worship unto God and blessing towards others. Again, as we love God in each of these ways, the Lord will so work within us to love our neighbors and seek to bless and support them in all the ways that the Lord is calling us to.

No matter what happens around us in 2024, as we seek to live out these two greatest commandments we can have confidence that 2024 will be our best year thus far.





Beginning in March we will have a new sermon series entitled *Jesus and the Jewish Calendar*. I'm really excited about this series and it will focus on how we are to see and understand the various special days in the Jewish calendar as Christians today. I invite your prayers for this series to be all the Lord wants it to be.



#### January Bible Books of the Month – Amos and Obadiah

Happy 2024 everyone! One of the ways that we can get off to a strong start to the 2024 year is to be digging deep into God's Word. For the month of January, we are highlighting two of the "minor prophets," Amos and Obadiah.



Looking first at Amos, there are a number of important themes that this book holds.

One theme is God's sovereignty. We see this in how the Lord addresses the various sins of the nations. And the Lord is not only sovereign over the nations, but also the Maker of all the heavens, as Amos 5:8 describes Him as the One who made constellations such as the Pleiades and Orion. Truly, the Lord is not just the God of Israel, but He is the God whom all people stand accountable to. A second theme is that the Lord is just and judges rightly. Related to this is that God calls His people to hate evil and to stand for fairness and justice in their relationships with one another. Amos makes it clear that how we love our neighbors and interact with others is greatly connected to how we love and serve God. It is hard, if not impossible, to do the latter without practicing the former. Other themes include the call to repent of sin and to turn wholeheartedly to God (see chapter 5) and the promise that one day God will restore the kingly line of David (see 9:11). This was fulfilled with the coming of Jesus Christ, as we just celebrated with Christmas!

In the Book of Obadiah, the prophet zooms in to highlight the sins of Edom and how in their pride they sinned greatly against God by their actions taken against Israel. While Amos does mention the sins of Edom in Amos 1:11-23, Obadiah expands on the root cause of pride and how it led to Edom's transgression. This book is a reminder to guard ourselves against the sin of pride and to be intentional in cultivating humility into our daily living.

May these books strengthen your faith, increase your hope, and fill you with God's love.

For the month of **February** we will be in the book of <u>Acts</u>.




#### **New Youth Group Starting!**

<u>Our schedule for 2024 will be meeting in Feb, March, May, Sept, and Nov</u>. With less to read, we hope more people can participate. Chestnut Grove's Book Club is now holding their book gathering discussions at the <u>Dillsburg Library from 10:15AM-11:30AM</u>.



Our book study for <u>February 12</u>, 2024 will be "<u>When Jesus Wept"</u> (by Bodie and Brock Thoene). Set against the political and religious turmoil of the times, the Thoenes' story vividly reimagines the evolving friendship between Jesus and Lazarus." --Publishers Weekly.

LAZARUS--the man Jesus raised from the dead is one of the most extraordinary encounters with The Living Savior in all of Scripture. But the life of Lazarus holds interest well beyond this miraculous event. Living in Bethany, near Jerusalem, Lazarus was a good friend of Jesus.

The authors imagine Lazarus owning a vineyard and devoting his life to caring for its vines and fruit. But he encountered another man--Jesus--whose vineyard was the world, its fruit the eternal souls of men. When Lazarus's story and the story of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection touch in When Jesus Wept, we are offered a unique vision into the power and comfort of Christ's love.

Brock and Bodie Thoene's most powerful and climactic writing project to date, When Jesus Wept, captures the power and the passion of the men and women who lived through the most important days in the history of the world.

Our book study for <u>March 11</u> will be <u>"Take This Cup"</u> (by Bodie and Brock Thoene). Based on Scripture and resonating with historical detail comes a beautiful, fully imagined story of a young child and his role in the Last Supper of Jesus Christ. When Nehemiah, the child of Jewish exiles, begins hearing whispers and experiencing portentous visions, it quickly becomes clear to his father and his rabbi that the young cupbearer is meant for a higher purpose . . . but what? Certain that the Messiah is alive at that very moment, the family waits for the boy's destiny to be revealed. In *Take This Cup*, the second installment of the Jerusalem Chronicles, Bodie & Brock Thoene

breathe new life into one of Scripture's most mysterious moments and expand their award-winning historical fiction with power and depth.






